Read: Luke 16:1-15 (NLT) & Matthew 6:19-21 (NLT)

Open:

- O Hypothetically, what would you do if you won the Power Ball? (*Note: This not an endorsement to play the Power Ball.) ©
- o Please name some things in this life that money cannot buy?
- o Define the word 'Steward' as a group by going around the room and offering insights.
- o *Bible Facts:* More than 500 verses on prayer, 500 verses on faith, and there more than 2,000 verses on money and possessions. 15% of Jesus' teachings pertained to money. Why are money and possessions discussed so much in the God's Word?

Dig:

Read: Luke 16:1-15, Parable of the Shrewd Manager (NLT)

- o Who is Jesus speaking to in telling the Parable of the Shrewd Manager in Luke 16:1-15?
- o In Luke 16:1 it says, "One day a report came that the Manager/Steward was wasting his employer's money." What does this say about the importance of accountability in the way we give?
- o It was not the Rich Man but the Manager/Steward who is functioning under the Rich Man's direction, power, and resourcing. What if we viewed ourselves as managing God's affairs like this, how would this change the way you give?
- o In verse 10 we see Jesus' key to teaching us about being stewards/managers of God's resources: ""One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much." What does it mean for us to be faithful with the little and God giving us more?
- o What was the Shrewd Manager's plan for taking care of the resources of the rich man? (see v.3-8)
- o In Luke 16:9, the Shrewd Manager has his heart set on eternity. How was Jesus reminding the disciples to think of eternity in this passage?
- O Do we have a heart for what matters in eternity when it comes to giving of our money and resources for that welcome into an eternal home?

Read: Matthew 6:19-21, Treasures in Heaven (NLT)

- o What does it mean for one "to store up treasures on earth, where moths and rust destroy them?" (v.19)
- How can we, in the here and now, store up treasures in heaven? Practically, what does this look like for us? (v.20)
- o Jesus says in Matthew 6:21, "Where your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be." How does God use money to test our hearts?

Reflect:

- o How does your perspective/attitude shift when it comes to the understanding that being a steward of God's resources begins with knowing that everything belongs to HIM in the first place?
- o True Riches means to have Jesus' presence, peace, power, provision, protection of God, that results in the fullness of joy. Have you ever see giving, tithing, stewardship in this way before? Why or why not?
- o Discuss this as a group the **Path to True Riches**: (1) Make a list of your stewardship. (2) Develop a shrewd plan/budget. (3) Leverage what you have for God and for eternity.
- o Encourage group to use the Budget Sheet the Campus Pastors presented on Sunday.
