BCC Connection Group Questions: February 19, 2023 (Week 3) SERMON SERIES: "THEY WILL KNOW WE ARE CHRISTIANS BY OUR LOVE"

*Leaders Note: Just a reminder that this is a guide to help facilitate your group. You do not have to cover all of the material on this lesson.

READ: John 13:34-35, Matthew 5:43-48, Romans 12:9, Colossians 1:21-22, John 3:16

OPEN:

- o Share a moment from your week when you encountered the love of God?
- o Have you ever been in a place where you felt distinctly different and how did you feel? Briefly share.
- o How do we love those that are distinctly different? What are some ways to demonstrate this to the world?

DIG:

Read: Matthew 5:43-48 (NLT)

- o Jesus says in Matt. 5:43-44, presents a different picture on love when He said to, "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." Describe why this is countercultural in Jesus' time and in 2023.
- o What does loving tour enemies or those who persecute us demonstrate to the world?
- o Who can we love those distinctly different than us in the world, as Christ calls us, without accepting their agenda? o Jesus' challenges believers in Matt. 5:46-48 by saying that, "If you love only those who love you, what reward is there for that?" what good is that! Everybody is nice to their friends; it takes a person of maturity and strength to love those who can do nothing for them. What is required of the follower of Jesus in practicing our faith? o Discuss: Love is actively doing what the Lord prefers with Him, Jesus living His life through us. Love by choice not by circumstances.
- o Discuss Agape love. (agapao) to love, actively doing what the LORD prefers, with HIM by His power and direction.

Read: Colossians 1:21-22 (NLT)

- o According to Paul in this passage, how were you and I once far from God?
- o How are we reconciled to God?
- o How does God see each one of us?
- o What is the call of believers of Christ to those who are hostile toward us?
- o Romans 12:9 (NLT) call us to specific things in this passage? (Leaders Note: love others, don't pretend but do it, hate what is wrong, cling to what is good)

REFLECT:

- o Do you have enemies in your life?
- o In Luke 10:39 (NLT Jesus addresses the "who is my neighbor?" attitude. Why do we look for loopholes (reasons not to love) and make those our enemies, who have a different demographic, socio-economic status, race, different political worldview, or sexual orientation than us?
- o What is the focus of Biblical love? What is the attitude of the heart to loving our enemies or those distinctly different?
- o Discuss the Big Idea from this past Sunday: By loving those in the world demonstrates these three things: 1) We are children of God. 2) We are different than the world. 3) We are mature in Christ.
- o What are the two or three things the Holy Spirit spoke most clearly to you this this connection group today and how will you respond to Him?
